

Overfilling Prevention Device



Identified by a triangle shaped handle with the letters OPD stamped on the handwheel

Your valve handle should look like this, otherwise your barbecue tank may not be in compliance with National Fire and Safety Association (NFPA) standards.

The NFPA code 58-2-3.1.5 states that **effective April 1, 2002**, no grill cylinder shall be filled unless equipped with an Overfilling Prevention Device (OPD) valve. This includes all cylinder sizes from 4# to 40#. Excluded are forklift, welding, and cutting gas cylinders.

Be Aware and Be Safe.

Check with your retail marketer if you need to upgrade your cylinder.

Have a spare and never run out of propane.
